

Hall I'th'Wood Medieval Graffiti Tour

Saturday 18th March 2017, 2pm – 3.30pm

Join *Bolton Archaeology and Egyptology Society* for a tour of the history of Hall I'th'Wood, home of Samuel Crompton, the inventor of the Spinning Mule.

Get a chance to see hidden areas of the building usually closed to the public!

The tour will show recently discovered medieval graffiti, popularly known as 'witch marks', but were a historical way of protection from a number of phenomenon, and get a chance to spot it yourself!

- good footwear (floors are uneven)
- a jacket, jumper or cardigan (attic spaces can be a little chilly)
- a keen eye (to spot the graffiti)
